Treasure Island Casino

We will be sharing a coach bus to Treasure Island Casino on Monday, August 5 with participants from the Crow River Senior Center. The bus will depart the Monticello Community Center at 8 a.m. and return at approximately 4 p.m. Cost is \$25 and those going will receive \$15 on their casino card and \$5 off food.

Lake Minnetonka Charter Cruise

Excelsior Streetcar

Enjoy a nice lunch at Maynard's Restaurant on the shores of Lake Minnetonka on Thursday, October 3. You will be served a half sandwich, cup of soup, and a non-alcoholic beverage.

After lunch, you take a trolley ride along a half-mile of track and stop at the car barn to view a photo gallery from the 1800's and see work in progress on a streetcar restoration.

After the trolley ride, an historian from the Excelsior Lake Minnetonka Historical Society will give a walking tour along the 3 blocks of Water Street in downtown Excelsior for those that are interested. There will be time to shop in downtown Excelsior and enjoy the quaint shops on Water Street. The motor coach can make some shuttle runs along Water Street.

The bus departs the community center at 9:30 a.m. and returns at about 4:45 p.m. The cost of \$87 per person includes coach transportation, lunch, tours, and escort.
