

LEGAL SERVICES

The St. Cloud office of Mid-Minnesota Legal Aid has received a grant of Older Americans Act funds from the Central Minnesota Council on Aging to provide legal services for seniors residing in Wright County. The funds will be used to provide legal advice, counseling and representation in court and administrative hearings. There is no cost for these services. If you are 60 years or older and reside in Wright County, you can get help with legal problems involving Medicare, Social Security, eviction or other housing problems, public benefits, such as medical assistance, food support and fuel assistance, family law issues, including domestic abuse and income maintenance, nursing home problems, home care services, powers of attorney, health care directives and debt collection. No help for criminal matters, wills, estate planning or real estate transactions. Seniors can also call the St. Cloud office of Mid-Minnesota Legal Aid toll free at 1-888-360-2889 for scheduling an appointment. Online access at https://mylegalaid.org. Minnesota Legal Aid accepts contributions for legal services, but contributions are not required to receive legal help. Legal Aid Appointments are held monthly at the Crow River Senior Center.

The Surprises of Genealogy

Genealogy study can bring unexpected surprises in the family tree. This is one of mine.

Mary was born in 1640, probably in England. Her parents, John and Hannah or Anna Ayer sailed with their family to the Massachusetts Bay colony while she was a small child and after moving around several times, settled in Haverhill, MA in 1647. When she was 15 she married Nathan Parker, a widower and local scribe. He had a son already and together they had nine more. Two sons died in their early twenties, but their daughter, Hannah married and had children and is an ancestor of Louis Cook, my grandfather.

Nathan died in 1685 when Mary was It is believed that she lived with her oldest son, John. Her sister Rebecca lived nearby.

In early 1692 the first accusations of witchcraft were made in nearby Salem Village. In late May a resident of Andover, Martha Carrier was accused. Two years earlier she had been accused of bringing small pox to town resulting in the death of thirteen people. Other members of the Carrier family were also accused.

In mid-July Joseph Ballard invited two of the afflicted girls from Salem to come to Andover because he feared that his ailing wife was afflicted by witches. Because of this many were accused and faced a terrible choice. If they confessed and "repented" they were released. Otherwise, they would be tried and if convicted they would be hung. In all 44 citizens of Andover were accused.

In late August two afflicted girls from Andover said they had been tormented by the specter of Mary Ayer Parker. She was arrested along with several other women from her family. When she was examined by the Salem magistrates, the afflicted girls acted as if they were in pain. When she touched them they acted normally again. It was believed that the evil would flow back into the witch and this was an acceptable way of identifying the guilty. Mary Warren, a girl from Salem, was present and came forward with a pin stuck in her hand and blamed Mary Parker. Mary asked if it was a case of mistaken identity as there were three other Mary Parkers in Andover, but the witnesses were sure it was her that caused their symptoms.

Years earlier an Andover resident, Thomas Chandler took Hopestill Tyler, son of Job Tyler, as an apprentice and the legally binding contract was given to Nathan Parker for safekeeping. Four years later Job wished to end the contract and the document was stolen by Moses Tyler when Nathan and Mary were not home. When a trial was held, Nathan testified against the Tylers and they lost the suit. The stepdaughter of Moses Tyler was the first to make an accusation against Mary Parker. Ironically, Mary's daughter Hannah was married to John Tyler another of Job's sons. Hannah was accused of witchcraft by Job but not tried. One of Job's daughters, also named Mary, was accused, tried and convicted, but was reprieved. Hopestill's wife was accused and confessed and was freed.

Mary was tried in mid-September. Two citizens of Andover who had confessed to witchcraft testified that they had seen Mary afflict others. One of these was a fifteen-year-old boy. She was hung on September 22 along with seven others. These were the last executions in the Salem Witch trials. In 1711 she was formally cleared of the accusation of witchcraft.

I was able to discover many of my ancestors because my great-grandmother's sister wrote down as much of the family history as she could discover in the early 1900's. I have built on her work with the access that computers has given to us. You can do for your descendants what she did for us by putting down as much as you know about your family and even including stories that may or may not be entirely true. By doing this you will open doors for them to explore as they build on your work.

HOME PROGRAM

The HOME Program Wright County

Are you one of the 90% of seniors who want to stay in your own home as you age but are having a hard time handling some household chores or maintenance? We are excited that help is now available for residents age 60 and over in St. Michael, Albertville, Becker, Big Lake, Buffalo, Elk River, Hanover, Otsego, Rockford, Monticello and Zimmerman through the HOME program of Senior Community Services.

HOME services include handyperson tasks such as changing light bulbs, installing safety devices, minor plumbing, minor electrical repair, checking carbon monoxide/smoke detectors, changing furnace filters, and hanging wall décor. Other services include housekeeping such as dusting, sweeping, mopping, cleaning kitchen and bathroom surfaces, laundry and grocery shopping. Outdoor services include snow removal, lawn mowing, window washing, seasonal leaf raking and yard maintenance. Our expansion to Wright County also brings job opportunities in the following areas: housekeeping staff, handyperson work, tech support, lawn care contractor, snow removal, repair and painting staff. We also welcome volunteers of all ages and abilities. HOME services are provided to age-qualified individuals at any income level. Lower income residents contribute to the cost of the service on a sliding fee scale based on their monthly income and ability to pay, and the HOME Program does accept some insurance payments. If you are a senior, a caregiver, or know someone who could use a little extra help with household chores, yard work or minor maintenance repairs, contact the HOME Team at the above number or email address.
