Ladies of the Monticello American Sewing Guild are offering a free Clothing Fix-It Clinic for seniors on Thursday, February 13 from 12:30-3:30 p.m.

Bring in your clothing for simple repairs and alterations while you wait. Examples of on-site fixes they can make include: replace buttons, replace zipper slides (if they have replacement parts), simple hems, patch small holes/tears.

Contact the senior center for a 30-minute time slot. PLEASE make sure your clothing is cleaned before bringing it in.

Tax Assistance Begins This Month

Low to moderate-income people of all ages can get their taxes prepared at the center free of charge on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays from February 3 thru April 10. Appointments are required.

Be sure to bring with you to your appointment a copy of your last return, picture ID, Social Security card, W2's, 1099's, SSA-1099 forms and other income and/or tax documents for 2024 and rent receipts (CRP) for 2024 or property tax statements for 2024 and 2025.

Be sure to organize your information <u>before</u> your appointment.
