Tax Assistance **Begins in February**

Low to moderate-income people of all ages can get their taxes prepared at the center free of charge on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays from February 2 thru April 13. Appointments are required and can be made starting January 3.

Be sure to bring with you to your appointment a copy of your last return, picture ID, Social Security card, W2's, 1099's, SSA-1099 forms and other income and/or tax documents for 2022 and rent receipts (CRP) for 2022 or property tax statements for 2022 and 2023.

Be sure to organize your information before your appointment.

You can ride the coach bus to Treasure Island Casino on Monday, January 9. The bus will depart the Monticello Community Center at 8:30 a.m. and return at approximately 3:45 p.m. There is a \$20 charge and those going will receive \$15 on their casino card and \$3 off food.

Summit Avenue Splendor

Enjoy a coach bus ride to St. Paul and drive along Summit Avenue with a tour guide on Thursday, January 19, 2023. You will receive a narrated tour about the history of the homes such as who may have lived there and unique information about their architectural style.

After the narrated tour you will be dropped off at James J Hill House for a guided tour of the 42-room mansion. Following the tour, board the bus to go eat at the popular neighborhood restaurant, Tavern on Grand. Your menu choices are a Walleye Basket or Chicken Basket. Her solo performance reflects the beauty and hardships of Molter's solitary yet satisfying life and pushes back against the premise that her time in the North Woods made her the "Loneliest Woman in America" as the *Saturday Evening Post* claimed in 1952. The performance is funny, smart and passionate and it is sure to delight all.

After the show you will have lunch at Keys Café featuring a turkey, mashed potatoes and gravy, stuffing, vegetable, cranberries, bread, beverage and dessert. The cost is \$85 per person. The bus departs the community center at 8:15 a.m. and returns at about 3:45 p.m. Register ASAP if you are interested in going on this trip.

Irish History Tour

Enjoy a fun filled day in St. Paul on Thursday, March 9 learning about all things Irish! A costumed tour guide will board the motor coach and take you on a tour around St Paul. Drop off or mail payment (cash or check) to the center in advance. Checks are payable to the Monticello Senior Center. Class size is limited and people must register in advance. Please note that refunds will not be given for no-shows.

Caregiver Support Group

This group is facilitated by Licensed Social Worker Becky Allard, provides specialized support and education, and is intended for nonprofessional caregivers.

HOME Program
