#### **2** Treasure Island Casino Trips

You can ride the coach bus to Treasure Island Casino on Monday, July 11 and/or August 1. For each trip the bus will depart the community center at 8:30 a.m. and return at about 3:45 p.m. There is an \$20 bus ride charge for each trip and those going will receive \$15 on their casino card and a \$3 off food coupon. Please sign up and pay at least one week prior to the trip dates.

#### **<u>Riverboat Cruise</u>**
