#### **Treasure Island Casino**

We will be sharing a coach bus to Treasure Island Casino on Monday, July 1 with participants from the Rogers Senior Center. The bus will depart the Monticello Community Center at 8 a.m. and return at approximately 4:15 p.m. Cost is \$25 and those going will receive \$15 on their casino card and \$5 off food.

#### Schell's Brewery and New Ulm

The first stop on this July 17 trip to New Ulm will be at the Visitors Center where a local guide will step on the motor coach for a riding tour, concluding at the Glockenspiel Musical Tower where you will hear the bells chime.

You will walk a block (or can reload the bus) to have lunch at Veigel's Kaiserhoff Restaurant. Please indicate your menu choice at the time of registration (both include non-alcoholic beverage): 1)Landjaeger Old German Style Pork and Beef Smoked Sausage, hot German potato salad, sauerkraut, rye bread; 2)Beer Battered Cod Basket, french fries, cole slaw.

After lunch you will tour the August Schell's Brewery. You will be walking or standing for over an hour on this tour (collapsable wheelchairs, walkers, and canes will fit in the bus's luggage bays). You will have time to visit the museum and sample beers in the tap room. Following the tour, you may stroll through the gardens and the gift store before departing for home. The cost is \$89 and the bus will depart the community center at 7:30 a.m. and return at about 5:45 p.m.

#### **Treasure Island Casino**

We will be sharing a coach bus to Treasure Island Casino on Monday, August 5 with participants from the Crow River Senior Center. The bus will depart the Monticello Community Center at 8 a.m. and return at approximately 4:15 p.m. Cost is \$25 and those going will receive \$15 on their casino card and \$5 off food.

#### Lake Minnetonka Charter Cruise

You can enjoy a leisurely 1.5-hour ride around Lake Minnetonka aboard an Al & Alma's charter boat on Monday, August 12. The coach bus will depart the community center at 9:45 a.m. and return at about 2:45 p.m.


#### One on One Technology Support


