

SMART DRIVER COURSES

People age 55+ completing an AARP Smart Driver Course are eligible for a 10% auto insurance discount. The cost is \$17 for AARP members and \$22 for non-members and you must sign up and pay at the senior center in advance. *Effective July 1, the course fee increases to \$22 for AARP members and \$27 for non-members.* Included in this cost are the AARP class materials and a facility/host fee. AARP members should bring their membership card to class and everyone should bring his or her driver's license. Refunds will not be given for no-shows.

Those taking a Smart Driver class for the first time must take an eight-hour course. A refresher course must be taken every three years in order to be eligible to continue receiving the insurance discount.

Be sure to bring with you to your appointment a copy of your last return, picture ID, Social Security card, W2's, 1099's, SSA-1099 forms and other income and/or tax documents for 2019 and rent receipts (CRP) for 2019 or property tax statements for 2019 and 2020.

Please be sure to organize your information <u>before</u> your appointment.
