Tax Assistance Offered

Low to moderate income persons can get help filing their tax forms. Contact the senior center to schedule an appointment, which will be offered on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays thru April 12. There is no charge for this service and space is limited.

Be sure to bring with you to your appointment the completed intake papers you picked up from the center, your personal tax documents, photo ID, Social Security number documentation, blank check for direct deposit.

Masks will be required while meeting with the volunteer tax preparer.

St. Patrick's Day Dinner & Party

Sign up in advance for our noon St. Patrick's Day dinner on Thursday, March 17. Dinner will feature corned beef & cabbage, carrots, dinner roll, and dessert. The cost is \$5 per person.



Treasure Island Casino

Ride the coach bus to Treasure Island Casino on Monday, March 7. The bus departs the community center at 8:30 a.m. and returns at about 3:45 p.m. There is an \$18 charge for the bus ride and those going will receive \$15 on their casino card and a \$3 off food coupon.

Mystic Lake Casino

You can ride the coach bus to Mystic Lake Casino on Monday, April 4. The bus departs the community center at 8:30 a.m. and returns at about 3:15 p.m. Due to increased bus rental costs, the casino trip charge has been raised to \$20. Those going will receive \$15 on their casino card and a \$4 off food coupon.

St. Paul Sinners and Saints

Arrive at the Landmark Center in St. Paul On April 6 for a Gangster Tour. These tours are enhanced by humorous and lively costumed guides who adopt the personae of the infamous gangsters who resided in St. Paul during the 1930s, telling of their "lives as gangsters" and how the criminal justice system functioned during that era. Then enjoy lunch at Kéy's Café where the menu includes luncheon portion turkey dinner with all the trimmings, beverage, and dessert.

Next there will be a guided tour of the St. Paul Cathedral. It is the 3rd largest completed church in the United States, and the 4th tallest. The interior is illuminated by 24 stained glass windows featuring angelic choirs. The building was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1974. After the tour, visit the space at your own pace, and stop by gift Kiosks to purchase a memento of your visit.

The cost is \$84 per person. The bus will depart the community center at 8:30 a.m. and return at about 4 p.m. **Deadline to register is March 6.**

Barn Quilt & Picturesque Farm Sites

Share a bus with seniors from Elk River on May 11 as you take a trip to Carver County to explore one of the largest open-air galleries in Minnesota amidst the beautiful countryside. A ride-along Quilt Barn Tour Guide will share with you the history of the quilts and the barns. On the route you will see impressive works such as: "Lone Star"- the Kramer Farm; "Fannies Fan"- The Granary; "Custom Block"- The Honebrink Farm; "Hopscotch"- The Drees Farm; "Triple Tulip"- The Willems Family Hollander Farm; "Floral Pattern"- The Sunny Hill Farm. You will have the opportunity to get off the bus and go inside a barn as well as shop for souvenirs, books, and gifts.

Enjoy a boxed lunch at the Outpost Barn Event Center, which is a unique space designed for people to enjoy the quiet serenity of rural Minnesota. Menu: croissant sandwich, pickle, chips, cookie, and bottled water.

The cost is \$74 per person and the deadline to register is April 11. The bus will depart the community center at 8 a.m. and return at 4 p.m.

Free Legal Services

People age 60+ can get free legal services at the center offered by the Senior Law Project on Monday, March 28. They can help with Social Security, family law matters, consumer and housing issues, Medicare, nursing home issues, Power of Attorney and Health Care Directives, Medical Assistance, and other public benefits programs.

Appointments are required.

Please note that help cannot be provided for wills, criminal matters, estate planning, or real estate transactions.

Memory Café

Our Activity Hour Memory Café is a safe and comfortable place where caregivers and their loved ones with memory loss can participate together in a creative activity while socializing with others. The café experience is free, and all the supplies are provided for you.

These Memory Cafés are held on the 4th Wednesday of each month (March 23) from 1:30-2:30 p.m. If you wish to participate in person at the Crow River Senior Center, call 763-497-8900. If you wish to participate at the Monticello Senior Center via Zoom, call 763-295-2000.

Tech Support is Available

Mary, a very tech-savvy volunteer comes to our center on Tuesday mornings to help people with technology issues. If you would like to meet with her, you can call to schedule an appointment and there is no charge. Be sure to bring your equipment with you to your appointment. Caregiver Support Group

If you are caring for someone either close or from afar, be sure to check out the Caregiver Support Group that meets at the center on the 2nd Thursday of each month (March 10) from 10:30 a.m. to noon.

This group is facilitated by Licensed Social Worker Becky Allard, provides specialized support and education, and is intended for nonprofessional caregivers. Call the center at 763-295-2000 if you plan to attend.

HOME Program

The senior center's HOME Program can assist older adults with maintenance and cleaning both indoors and out. Help is available on a sliding fee scale with housekeeping, minor repair services, painting, snow removal, etc. All staff take precautions to ensure safety.
