Senior Center Protocol...

- ⇒Governor Walz's Stay Safe MN order currently allows for groups of up to 10 people in the senior center at one time.
- ⇒Participants need to wear a mask. If you have one please bring it with you. If you do not have a mask we will provide one for you to keep.
- ⇒Wellness checks will be given at the door (temperature & simple questions asked).
- ⇒We ask that each participant sign a waiver document (only necessary once).
- ⇒A plexiglass buffer has been installed at the receptionist counter.
- ⇒Participants should stay at least 6' apart and should wash their hands frequently.
- ⇒Hand sanitizers are located throughout the center. Please use them often.
- ⇒Advance registration will be required for all activities until further notice.
- ⇒Drop-in participation will not be available while group numbers are limited.
- ⇒No food or beverages will be served or shared in the senior center.
- ⇒We will temporarily stop accepting donations of all items except excess produce (and money, of course).
