Treasure Island Casino-2 Trips

Ride the coach bus to Treasure Island Casino on Mondays, September 13 and/or October 4. The bus departs the community center at 8:30 a.m. and returns at about 3:45 p.m. There is an \$18 charge for each trip and those going will receive \$15 on their casino card and a \$3 off food coupon.

You must sign up for each trip separately.

Explore Northfield

Share a bus with seniors from Elk River on October 12 as you travel to Northfield to learn all about this charming town located along the banks of the Cannon River. First stop will be at the Northfield Historical Society Museum where you can explore the exhibits and shop for souvenirs in the museum gift store. Lunch will be at the Ole Store Restaurant. You will be served a Swedish Meatball Luncheon which includes a beverage and a cookie.

After lunch a local guide will board the coach bus with you and give you a tour of the town and talk about the history of Northfield. The final stop will be to the Fireside Orchard and Garden Store where you may purchase jams, local cheeses, maple syrup, and other goodies.

The cost is \$71 per person. The coach bus departs the community center at 8 a.m. and returns at about 5:15 p.m. The registration deadline is September 20.
