The Luck of the Pot...

It's hard to trace the potluck back to a specific source, but it's fair to say the term was used in the Middle Ages to describe an impromptu meal served to unexpected guests or travelers. Such a drop-in at the dinner hour would get "the luck of the pot:" whatever food was left over or kept on the simmer.

Sometimes a potluck referred to a onepot communal meal in which every cook brought something to add, rather like a "stone soup." It wasn't until the late 19th and early 20th century in America that the idea of a meal where everyone brings a prepared dish to share took hold.
