

Tuesday, September 12 at 10 am


We'll visit the "Coney Island of the West". Meet at Waconia Regional Park at 10 am for a pontoon ride to the island.





History of Labor Day

Observed the first Monday in September,
Labor Day is an annual celebration of the
social and economic achievements of
American workers. The holiday is rooted in
the late nineteenth century, when labor
activists pushed for a federal holiday to
recognize the many contributions workers
have made to America's strength,
prosperity, and well-being.

Congress passed an act on June 28, 1894, making the first Monday in September of each year a legal holiday.
